The tear drop shaped island of Sri Lanka lies in the Indian Ocean just off the southern tip of India. With its golden sandy beaches, azure blue waters and warm tropical climate, Sri Lanka is a year-round destination for holidaymakers seeking sun, sand and sea.

The island has a rich cultural heritage that dates back over 2,000 years which is linked to the origins of Buddhism in the country with magnificently constructed stupas and the ruins of ancient kingdoms. Controlled from the 16th century onwards by the Portuguese, Dutch and finally the British prior to gaining full independence in 1948, the influences of colonial powers remain visible in architecture and a number of forts across the country.

Sri Lanka is recognised as a global biodiversity hotspot with a rich variety of endemic flora and fauna, and incredibly for a small island, can boast of large iconic animals such as the Asian elephant, leopard and the largest animal to have inhabited our planet, the blue whale. From palm fringed beaches to scrub jungles and numerous man-made lakes in the lowlands to tropical rainforests, cloud forests and highlands laden with waterfalls at its centre, this resplendent isle is abundant in natural beauty.



ENTRY/VISA REQUIREMENTS

- As for all international travel, the visitor to Sri Lanka is required to be in possession of a valid passport and visa.

 Travellers from all countries need a visa.
- We highly recommend you to apply for online visas (US\$ 35 for Tourist Visa) to avoid unnecessary delays in trying to obtain Visa on arrival, which can take an hour or so of waiting in line. SAARC Nationals pay US\$ 20 online, and US\$ 25 if applying on arrival. Please <u>click here</u> to apply online.
- A valid passport not less than 6 months, a confirmed return or onward air ticket and sufficient funds for the stay are the entry requirements to the country. If obtaining a visa on arrival, please pay by cash (US\$ 40 for Tourist Visa) since

payment by credit cards can take longer to process. You must carry a passport-sized photograph if obtaining a visa on arrival.

Day 2 - 20th February 2023 - Waikkal

Birders - Early morning and late afternoon boat ride at the Dutch canal off Waikkal through the mangroves to watch a variety of water birds

Explore the Gin Oya (river) and part of a 18th century Dutch canal lined with patches of mangrove (there are at least ten species in the area), riparian grasses, some old trees overhanging the water with nest holes, and patches of farmland. A variety of water birds including grey heron, purple heron, four species of kingfisher; white-throated kingfisher, common kingfisher, stork-billed and pied kingfisher, purple swamphen, black bittern, yellow bittern, Indian pond heron, lesser cormorant, Indian darter are often seen. Migrant species seen here include rosy starling, blue-tailed bee-eater, barn swallows and the Indian paradise flycatcher. Endemics including the Ceylon swallow and the crimson-fronted barbet.

Spouses - Proceed to Negombo and explore the vibrant Negombo fish market and old Dutch Fort. Lunch in Negombo will be included.





Negombo

Negombo is a bustling beach town located at the mouth of the Negombo Lagoon, 16 km to the south. This resort town offers its visitors the finest seafood restaurants and the liveliest places for entertainment along the coast. During the colonial era, the Portuguese converted many of the local Karavas, (Tamil and Sinhalese fishermen) to Catholicism. As a result, the area remains a stronghold of Christians with many churches and Catholic shrines. The Dutch built a canal to transport cinnamon and other spices from inland to the coast. Today, tourism has become the major source of income in Negombo. It is also home to one of the largest fish markets in the country.



Negombo Fish Market

The fish market in the bustling beach town of Negombo is teeming with activities from early morning. This is the main fish market of Negombo where fishermen haul in their catch for auctioning. In the mornings it is usually filled with a frenzy of activity with quick bargains and negotiations between buyers and sellers. While the fish market has plenty of fresh tuna, shark and seer from the Indian Ocean, it also has some of the island's finest jumbo prawns, mud crabs, ribbon fish lobsters as well as squid on sale. This highly active and vibrant fish market is closed on Sundays when the city's predominantly Catholic population heads to church.



The Negombo Fort.

The ruins of the old Dutch fort are located near the Negombo lagoon mouth. It was initially built as a trading post with fortification by the Portuguese. According to the historical records, the original rampart has been destroyed by the Dutch and restored in 1672. The original fort has had been protected by a dry moat around it with a drawbridge to access it. The British demolished it in the late nineteenth century and used its stones to build a prison. The visible remains of the fort are a part of the eastern wall with the main gate inscribed with the date 1678.

Lunch at Moksha Resort, Kitulgala

Moksha Resort, Kitulgala

True to the moniker Moksha, this luxurious boutique hotel - complete with 8 five-star class private rooms, restaurant, bar, pool, minibadminton court and pool bar - is nestled in 5 acres of private woodlands to offer you a quiet and peaceful retreat. Moksha understand the positive impact nature has on one's health and wellbeing and have a carefully curated space where one can rest and recuperate, embraced by the gentle arms of Mother Nature. Moksha is home to nature's wonders if you look close enough - From Crested Serpent Eagles, Brahminy Kites and Crested Hawk Eagles scouting their day's prey from the skies to Asian Giant Squirrels feeding their young with Jack Fruit growing around the property. From a host of endemic fish including the critically endangered Asoka Barbs that make our neighbouring "Liyan Oya" rivulet their home, to a host of rare trees such as the Ebony, Nedun, Kitul and Hora trees that make up our property, we are a delight for all nature lovers.

Birders - afternoon birding at the Kelani Valley Forest Reserve (Access to the reserve is via a river crossing on a dug-out canoe) for lowland endemics







The Kelani Valley Forest Reserve in Kitulgala was established to protect the watershed of the Kelani River and is home to many of Sri Lanka's endemic birds and amphibians. Access to the reserve is via a river crossing on a dug-out canoe. The endemics seen here include Sri Lanka hanging parrot, Layard's parakeet, green-billed coucal, chestnut-backed owlet, orange-billed babbler, spot-winged thrush and sub continental endemics such as the Malabar trogon and Sri Lanka frogmouth. It is also one of the few locations where the elusive Serendib scops owl may be seen.

Spouses - Stay at leisure or explore the resort surroundings

Spend 2 nights at Moksha Resort, Kitulgala in a Deluxe Room on full board basis



Day 4 - 22nd February 2023 -Kitulgala

Birders - Early morning and late afternoon birding around Kitulgala and the nearby Kelani valley forest reserve in search of lowland endemics

Target birds here include Sri Lanka hanging parrot, Layard's parakeet, green-billed coucal, chestnut-backed owlet, orange-billed babbler, spot-winged thrush and sub continental endemics such as the Malabar trogon and Sri Lanka frogmouth. It is also one of the few locations where the elusive Serendib scops owl may be seen.

Spouses - After breakfast go on a white water rafting session on Kelani river. This is the spot David Lean's Oscar winning Bridge on the River Kwai was filmed (1957).

Seven high quality, class II and III rapids and temperate waters make the Kelani a premier introduction to the sport of white-water or an exciting choice for experienced rafters. The river hosts rapids between grades 2 and 3, with the rafting stretch approximately 6.5 km in length, and taking between 45 minutes to 1.5 hours to complete, depending on water levels. With the Kelani's special "Killer Fall" and "Butter Crunch" rapids, rafters are guaranteed a challenge, but are also offered a chance to relax, with small calm stretches allowing a refreshing swim in the river to unwind. There are no "bad" times to raft. The river is dam controlled. Participants will wear life jackets and helmets for safety and will be guided by an expert team.

Day 5 - 23rd February 2023 -Kitulgala - Nuwara Eliya

Morning after breakfast at Moksha Resort, leave for Nuwara Eliya (approximately 3 hours' drive). There will be opportunistic birding spots en route.

Arrive in Nuwara Eliya and check-in to The Oliphant Bungalow



Spectacularly placed within tea gardens and mountains, The Oliphant Nuwara Eliya details the impressive features of a rustic English bungalow whilst catering to the needs the modern travellers. Nestled in Sri Lanka's highest elevated village, Shanthipura, the bungalow is your home in the countryside.

Lunch at Oliphant Bungalow

After lunch:





Birders - Afternoon, birding in Victoria Park for highland species and endemics

Birding around Victoria Park in search for highland species such as yellow-eared bulbul, Sri Lanka white-eye, velvet nuthatch, pied thrush. Migratory species such as Indian pita, Kashmir flycatcher and forest wagtail are also seen here during the winter months.

Spouses - Visit to the Nuwara Eliya town and explore the area

Nuwara Eliya is locally nicknamed as little England due to its cooler weather and its history for producing tea since colonial times. The views across Nuwara Eliya are quite breathtaking and it is a charming place to explore.

Spend 2 nights at The Oliphant Bungalow, Nuwara Eliya in a Luxury Room on full board basis





Day 6 - 24th February 2023 - Nuwara Eliya

Both Birders and Spouses - Early morning, make a pre-dawn start with a packed breakfast to visit Horton Plains National Park for primates, deer, highland bird species and endemics.

Horton Plains National Park

Horton Plains is Sri Lanka's highest elevated national park lying approximately 2,200 m (7,000 ft) above sea level and comprises of cloud forests and open grassland. Make an early morning start with a packed breakfast to Horton Plains National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and take a guided walk along the nature trails to a viewpoint known as World's End with spectacular views of the surrounding countryside. On the walk back you can stop over to see the impressive Baker's Falls in full flow. Sambar, Sri Lanka's largest species of deer are encountered regularly in the plains close to the entrance while the shaggy coated bear monkey (the montane race of the purple-faced leaf monkey) is occasionally seen within the forested areas.

Birding in Horton Plains





A variety of wildlife including endemic rhino-horned and hump-nosed lizards, highland bird species including the Sri Lanka white-eye, dull-blue flycatcher and yellow-eared bulbul are found here and can be seen close to the entrance. Black eagles and Himalayan buzzards are also seen. Horton Plains is one of the few known locations where elusive highland endemics such as the 'arrenga' or Sri Lanka whistling thrush and Sri Lanka bush warbler can be observed.

Lunch at the Oliphant Bungalow

Birders - Afternoon walking in Hakgala Botanical Gardens for endemic primates and highland species, including another chance for the Sri Lanka whistling thrush.

Hakgala Botanical Gardens

Start the tour with your naturalist guide at Hakgala botanical gardens, which was originally established for the purpose of cultivating Cinchona (quinine) in 1884. The name comes from a legend which says that Hanuman, god of the monkey, was sent to the Himalayas for a specific herb. He forgot what herb he wanted and decided to take a piece of the Himalayas back in his jaw, hoping that the herb will grow thereon. The gardens grow atop a mountain called Hakgala, which means "jaw rock'. In the present day, thousands of flora varieties, including various orchids and roses, are planted here. With your naturalist guide you can look for wildlife such as coated shaggy bear' monkey and abundant highland avian endemics such as rufous-bellied eagle, pied thrush, large-billed leaf warbler, velvet-fronted nuthatch, various flycatchers, woodpecker's and the Sri Lanka wood pigeon.

Spouses -Take a guided tour at a nearby tea estate and factory to see how Ceylon Tea, regarded as the world's finest, is grown.

Tea Plantation and Factory

Sri Lanka is one of the world's largest exporters of tea with a history dating back to 1867 when it was first introduced to the country. The hill country is abundant with many tea plantations and factories along its picturesque countryside, which provides the ideal climate for high grown tea. Estate Tea Pluckers can be seen deftly plucking tea which they fill into large baskets carried on their backs. On the way, you will pass estate trucks, each embossed with their estate names, taking the freshly collected tea leaves to the factories for processing. Visiting a tea plantation and a Factory is a rewarding experience as you get to learn more about the process of making tea as well as some interesting bits of history on its introduction to the country

Learning about tea does not mean herding only into a tea factory. There is much to touch on the ground as well. Starting from the bud, the workers, the rich history, tea culture and tasting is part and parcel as









your expert will guide you through these interesting avenues with an unmatched zeal.

Overnight at The Oliphant Bungalow, Nuwara Eliya



Day 7 - 25th February 2023 - Nuwara Eliya - Yala

After an early breakfast at Oliphant Bungalow, proceed to Yala (approximately 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours' drive). There will be opportunistic birding spots en route.

Garganey, lesser whistling-duck, pygmy goose, swamphens, moorhen, pheasant-tailed jacanas and kingfishers should be seen at roadside waterbodies.

Arrive in Yala and check in to Wild Coast Tented Lodge in time for a late lunch

Wild Coast, Yala:

Wild Coast is a luxurious tented lodge sits on a deserted beach on the edge of Yala National Park, the leopard hot spot in south eastern Sri Lanka. 28 vaulted "Cocoon" tents offer the comfort of a luxury hotel with the excitement of a safari-style wilderness experience. The airconditioned Cocoons measure a generous 55m2 and are furnished to the highest specification. They are dotted around five watering holes designed to attract a variety of birdlife and amphibians, which can be viewed from each Cocoon's outdoor viewing deck.

A bamboo-clad bar and restaurant serves creative daily changing menus, whilst a delicious "picnic tea" forms part of the safari drive experience. The lodge boasts a Sanctuary Spa offering a range of natural treatments developed in-house. The library doubles up as an educational centre where guests learn about the wildlife in the park and watch documentaries, further explained by the lodge's expert guides.







Both Birders and Spouses - Afterwards enjoy an exhilarating afternoon park drive traversing through the scrubby brush, vast grassland, dense woodland and sparkling lakes.

Wild Coast Lodge Park Drive

Surrounding Wild Coast Lodge is a range of habitats ranging from shrub jungle, plains, wetlands and riverine forests that offer a rich array of biodiversity as well as geological variations. The park drives are guided by rangers who interpret all aspects of our wilderness, paying attention to the entire spectrum of nature from the tiniest critters, plant species, birds, reptiles and amphibians, to the larger, and charismatic animals such as elephants, bear, and leopards.

Later enjoy delicious, authentic Sri Lankan cuisine in the Dining Pavilion, and sip colourful cocktails in the Ten Tuskers bar



Spend two nights at Wild Coast Tented Lodge, Yala in a Cocoon Suite and your stay is on All Inclusive Basis

Day 8 - 26th February 2023 - Yala

Birders -Early morning and late afternoon wildlife viewing and birding in Yala National Park

Yala National Park

Yala National Park is located in the south-east corner of Sri Lanka and is the most popular destination for wildlife viewing. Leopards are the star attraction at Yala and Block I is believed to have one of the highest concentrations of these big cats in the world. Leopards however are elusive by nature and we recommend a minimum of three to four game drives to have the best opportunities for good encounters. Asian elephant, sloth bear, jackal, sambar, spotted deer, buffalo, wild boar and the grey langur are among the other larger mammals that may be seen.

Yala is also an excellent birding destination with close to 300 avian species recorded; Indian peafowl and Sri Lanka jungle fowl, changeable hawk eagle, painted stork, Malabar-pied hornbills, chestnut, green and blue-tailed bee-eaters are among the species seen regularly in Yala. The varied landscapes from lagoons, beaches to rocky outcrops





immersed among the scrub jungle are a fascinating backdrop as you search out the park's wildlife.

Spouses - Option to visit to 12th to 14th century Buddhist sites around Thissamaharama area or spend the day at leisure and indulge in a glorious spa treatment with oils and scrubs that are created by Ceylon Tea and Ceylon cinnamon - **Spa cost not included.**

Overnight at Wild Coast Tented Lodge, Yala





Day 9 - 27th February 2023 - Yala - Weligama

Both Birders and Spouses - Early morning wildlife viewing from jeeps and birding for wetland species and winter migrants at Bundala National Park (approximately 1 hour drive)

Bundala National Park.

Bundala is Sri Lanka's first RAMSAR declared wetland comprising of brackish lagoons, salt pans and scrub jungle and is a popular destination for birders. Bundala is best visited in the winter months from December - February when migrants including caspian plover, red-necked phalarope, terek sandpiper. northern pintail, garganey, glossy ibis maybe seen. A large number of water birds and resident dry-zone species such as little grebe, watercock, greater thicknee and yellow-wattled lapwing can be seen year-round at Bundala. Mugger crocodiles and the larger and rarer estuarine crocodile may both be observed in Bundala with larger concentrations seen in the drier months around June - September. Asian elephant are also encountered here throughout the year in small numbers.





After breakfast, head to Weligama, a gorgeous village-style environment gazing out to the pristine Indian Ocean (approximately 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour drive)

Both Birders and Spouses - Arrive in Weligama and visit Top House which is a working Cinnamon Plantation and learn the whole process followed by a delicious lunch with the owner

Top House Exclusive Cinnamon Experience

Top House is a beautiful, working cinnamon estate of 25 acres, just inland from Weligama. Whale Watching, Mirissa:

Pods of spinner dolphin are seen on some mornings while sperm whales are occasionally seen especially around December and again in March-April sometimes in super pods numbering over 30 individuals. Bryde's whale, orca, Risso's dolphin, bottlenose dolphin and striped dolphin are among the other species of cetaceans which are seen a few times each season.
